WGBC Annual Planning Session Held in Wausau

Our annual planning day with the board and management staff was held in Wausau a few weeks ago. Vice president Brett Danke arranged for a wonderful meeting facility and a tour of the farm he manages afterwards.

We had a full agenda as things are developing quickly for the co-op. Anders Unseth provided a great deal of information to the board on a number of fronts. We discussed producers and cattle shipments, pricing for beef and pork, as well as new memberships. The goal is to be able to meet current and future demands for cattle.

Also, a review of our marketing efforts directly to consumers was reviewed in detail. One of our goals is to significantly increase sales. Because the direct-to-consumer boxes are shipped frozen and we have some flexibility on what is shipped to the buyers, this business offers flexibility and the opportunity to sell at higher margins.

Rod Ofte presented 2021 estimated results and the board reviewed 2022 budget. WGBC was awarded a \$250K grant from Rural Development to assist in developing our co-op. Rod has been working on the grant process for a long time and it's great to have this come to fruition! Rod will have more to share with the members on this super development.

The board is moving forward with our annual meeting for next year and it will be an in-person event! The meeting is planned for February 12th at the Wintergreen. We have listened to feedback and are making a few changes this year which we think will be well received. We look forward to once again spending time with our fellow members!

WGBC Cattle Transport Support Program

WGBC will support the cost for cattle to be shipped with reimbursement included in your payment for cattle. The amount of support will be determined by the mileage from your farm to the processor. The distance will be determined using a Rand McNally mileage calculator website using your farm address on file and the processor's location. Number of head will be counted when hanging weights are received from the processor and the support rate will be assigned as follows:

Distance	Reir	Reimbursement Rate	
0-49 miles	=	\$0/head	
50-99 miles	=	\$10/head	
100-149 miles	=	\$20/head	
150+ miles	=	\$30/head	
200+ miles	=	\$40/head	
250+ miles	=	\$50/head	

PLEASE NOTE: Members are responsible for payment to livestock haulers hired to transport cattle — as requested by that livestock hauler. The transaction for transporting livestock is between the member and the livestock hauler.

Reimbursement from WGBC will be paid later – included in the payment for your animals – and assigned per animal.

Pasture Walk Season Winds Down

Members Dale Gasser and Judy Fossen had a good turnout of more than 50 people for their pasture walk on October 6th. It was the last one in the Sauk County pasture walk series. That included representatives from NRCS, USDA Forage Research Lab, DNR, Compeer Financial, farmer-led groups and a few WGBC board and M-team members who helped promote the Co-op.

Narrows Valley Supply discussed the different warm-season annual mixes that were no-tilled into comparison plots on paddocks that were bale-grazed last winter. Sorgum-sudangrass/clover mixes had been grazed twice already this year and were 5-feet tall and ready for a 3rd rotation! We then toured the cattle handling pens and chutes that Dale built a few years ago so he can sort and load by himself if necessary. Beginners... you can't have enough gates; buy in bulk!

Judy printed WGBC info handouts and quite a few were taken, which shows producers are interested in learning more. Several had not heard of us before. She also printed out the Wisconsin Meadows photo flyer and placed that at the hot dog warmer in the food line, to get our brand/logo in front of people.

An NRCS employee later mentioned that Sauk County has the highest number, of all Wisconsin counties, of NRCS applications for grazing practices. It sounds like there is a lot of potential for WGBC membership and grass-fed beef production growth there. (Sauk County already has the most WGBC members so far, BTW!)

Everyone had a good time, and stuck around quite a while for the WGBC hot dogs and socializing. Many people went back for seconds, a good sign!



In Memoriam

Jon Robert Lee, 54, of Coon Valley, Wisconsin passed away July 24th, 2021, peacefully in his home, of pancreatic cancer.

Jon was born in La Crosse on January 8th, 1967, and grew up on the lovely Lee farm in Coon Valley (you may have seen the photo on our website!) He graduated from Westby Area High School in 1985, and met his wife Breta when they attended UW–La Crosse. Soon after they were married, they signed a contract to teach overseas which brought them to Qatar and the Philippines. They also travelled in Thailand, Vietnam, Egypt, Europe, and Australia, to name a few. After their children were born, they returned to the farm that had been in Jon's family for over a century.

Jon was an avid outdoorsman and cherished his time in nature. His love for photography started in high school and eventually became a lifelong business. Jon donated many hours and photos to our co-op to help with our early marketing efforts.

The Lee Family Farm joined our cooperative in 2010. Besides serving on the WGBC board of directors for 5 years, Jon spent countless hours doing tradeshows and grocery store demos – handing out samples of our products and putting a farmer face and his knowledge of grazing out there for our customers to connect with.
